

Two for Two

Begin with two squares and end with two 9 patch squares.

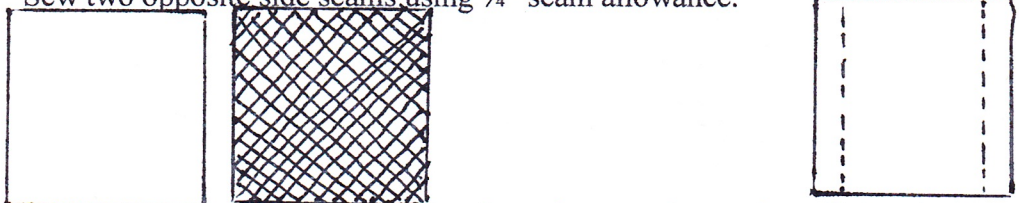
RST = right sides together all seams = 1/4"

Cut lines in red.

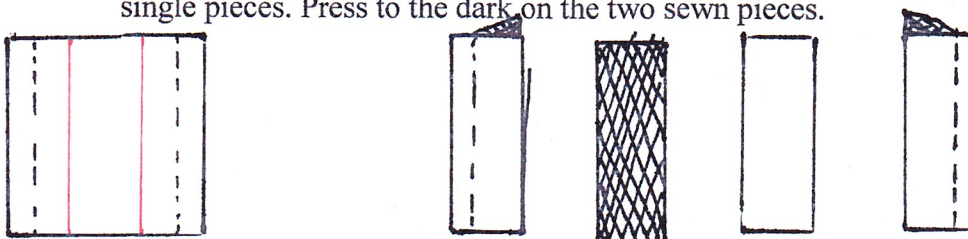
1. Add 1 1/2" to the finished size you want your 9 patch to be.
Tip: begin even larger (2"), spray starch 2 squares RST and trim to 1 1/2" larger.

2. Place light and dark squares RST. Spray and trim if you want.

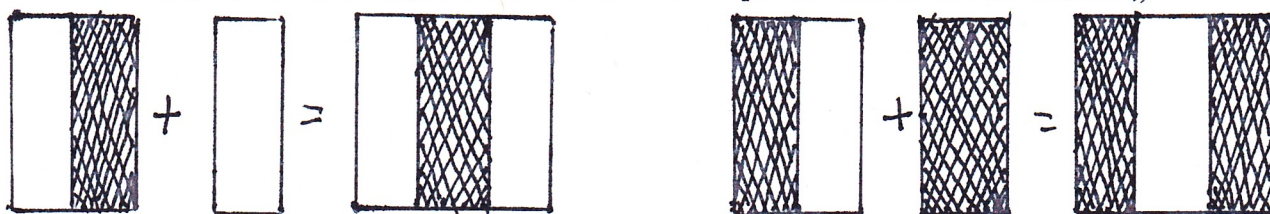
Sew two opposite side seams using 1/4" seam allowance.



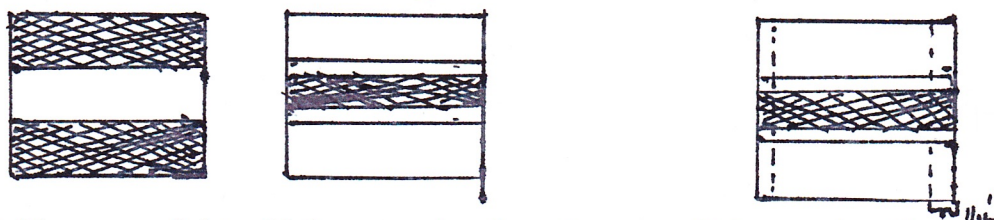
3. Cut this unit into thirds, measuring from the raw edge and parallel to the seam. Cut vertically, raw edge to raw edge. You now have two sewn pieces and two single pieces. Press to the dark on the two sewn pieces.



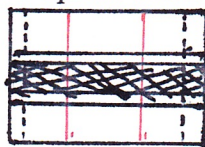
4. Sew the light single piece to the dark side of the sewn piece and the dark single piece to the light side of the other sewn piece. *Press to the dark sides. ;)*



5. Place these two units RST, matching the sewn seams. Sew the short end seams.



6. Cut this sewn unit into thirds, measuring from the sewn side's raw edge. You now have two 6 piece sections and two 3 piece sections. Press toward 2 dark squares.



7. Match the final pieces to each block to complete opposing 9 patch squares.
